Additional

Tina is the narrator.

Audio:

Child Narrator: Ellie is big, round and full of trees, oceans and animals. But she's not feeling so well. Can you guess why? People are making a lot of trash and not cleaning up. Can you help Ellie feel better? Click on the tree to find out. Ellie voice: I'm Ellie the Earth

Visual:



Hotspot drag and drop of a few trash pieces into the trash can.

TA DA! Sound effect as correct feedback

Additional

Audio:

Child narrator: Ellie is unhappy and not feeling well. Do you know why? People are leaving trash where it doesn't belong. We should always put trash in trash cans, not on the ground. Do you see the trash in the picture, even though there is a trash can right there? We can help Ellie by picking up trash when we see it. Click on the trash and move it to the trash can.

: Feedback: Confirm correct choice with a TA DA! Incorporate Ellie image

Click on trash and drag to correct bin.

Additional:

Audio: Child Narrator: Trash is anything we don't need anymore. But wait! Not everything needs to be thrown away. Some things can be used again or turned into new things. Let's learn what goes in the trash and what we can reuse or recycle. To help Ellie feel better, click and drag the pictures to where they belong.

Additional:

Audio: Child Narrator: You can be a reducer, too. Reduce means use only what you need. I turn off the faucet when I brush my teeth and I think about what I want to draw before I use paper, so I don't waste it. Also, I remember to turn off the lights when I leave a room..

Visual:



Click on faucet to reveal no drip. Click on lunch trash to reveal reusable lunchbox. Click on light bulb to reveal kid turning off the light.

Additional:

Audio: Child Narrator: Click on each picture to see how we can reduce and help Ellie the Earth!

Feedback: When picture is clicked, a way to reduce is revealed. Incorrect choice makes a BOINK sound.

My mom and I reused my old T-shirt.



Arrow will appear and then spin.

Additional

Audio: Child narrator: This was my favorite T-shirt that got too small for me. My mom helped me make it into a tote bag instead of throwing it out. Wow! My T-shirt has a new job! Reuse is when you make old things into new things.

Click on the things we can use again!



When a child clicks a correct item, it: glows or spins, a cheerful voice says: "Yes! You can use that again!"
A checkmark appears
When a child clicks a wrong item, it, shakes slightly, A gentle voice says: "Oops! That goes in the trash or recycle bin., A red X appears.

Audio: Child Narrator: Can you find the things that we can reuse instead of throwing out? Click on them to help Ellie, the Earth!

Visual:



When bin is clicked, object above appears and wiggles.

Audio: Child Narrator: When we put glass, plastic, metal and paper in the recycling bin, they go on a big truck to the recycling center. Machines help sort everything and break it down to make new stuff. Wow! A water bottle can become a cozy sweater!

Feedback: When learner clicks on bin, correct recyclable appears and wiggles.

Let's play the sorting game!

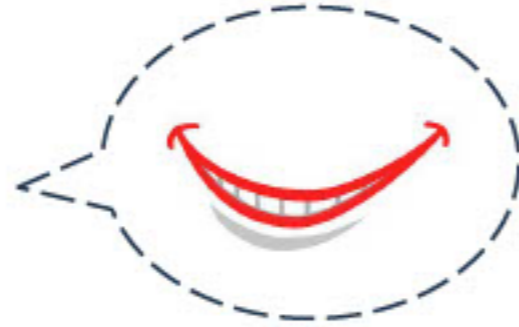


Drag and drop items into the correct bins. Last correct answer results in smiling earth pop-up.

Audio: Child Narrator: Can you help put the right items into the correct bins? When you're done, Ellie the Earth will smile!

Feedback: When last item is placed in correct bin, Narrator says, "Yes! Ellie is smiling!" and Ellie pops up.

On slide opening, globe grows and smile bubble appears. Narrator voice appears last

Audio: Child Narrator: Thank you for helping Ellie!

Feedback: TADA with confetti
